In this sense the FEI signed in July 2017 a MOU with the *Fédération Internationale de Tourisme Equestre (FITE)* whereby the FEI recognises FITE as the only international association responsible for the promotion of equestrian tourism, the regulation and the organisation of competitions of ridden or driven equestrian tourism, TREC (Equestrian Trail Riding Techniques) competitions both ridden or driven, **the pasture or working equitation** as well as other types of equine leisure activities as defined by the FITE General Assembly.

As a consequence of the above the FEI is not in a position to formalise a relationship with WAWE by means a MOU due to the fact that we already recognise FITE as the organisation responsible for working equitation.

Having said that, the FEI would be pleased to also cooperate with WAWE but given our existing relationship with FITE, their involvement would be a pre-requisite. Consequently, we invite you to contact FITE in order to investigate how such collaboration could work in practice. We look forward to see the outcome of your discussion with FITE.

Finally, I would like to thank you for your invitation to the World Championship in Munich (Germany) next 10 to 13 May which unfortunately I have to decline this time as I am not available on these days.
